Please keep upholding them in prayer. They went to visit a show house that is very similar to what they would like to buy and it is beautiful, they were both very impressed with it....so were we - we could have taken up squatters rights there and then!!!! But to get one of these houses they need to be able to put a deposit on it relatively soon as there are not a lot of these particular houses to be built on the site. We appreciate that you are praying into this situation.

### The Reason for the Season

This morning I was making up some teabag packets that I'd designed for Christmas and 'Jesus is the reason for the season' was going through my mind. No! don't rush away and say it's too early for Christmas thinking yet! ..... That was just what started my train of thought! As I thought about these words I started to think of seasons we go through. Seasons when things seem tough going, seasons when troubles jump up and grab us, and seasons when things go great. Why do we have these seasons? Because God is seasoning us! We are seasoned for a reason. Nothing happens to us that is a surprise to God - and God uses those times of trial to build us up, encourage us, and prepare us for something He has in store for us further down the line. Walter was delivered, set free from the power of alcoholism, and God has used that because Walter can speak to people suffering from that problem and know where they are coming from. Our life experiences can always be used for God's Glory. A woman who has been a battered wife can minister to battered women in a way no one else can. I am not saying that God can only use ex alcoholics to minister to alcoholics or ex offenders to minister in prison - we wouldn't get very far if that was the case - but if people have been through certain things then those experiences can be put to use to minister to others. When trouble comes our way do we blame God for it? Or do we praise Him and thank Him for being there with us, helping us. I was thinking of a piece of meat I bought a few years back. It was just one small thick lump and I had to make it feed four of us. I laid that piece of meat on the board and I thumped it with a rolling pin to stretch it out, I prodded it with a fork, I added some things to it, cut it in four and cooked it .... That lump of cheap meat had become tender and tasty and fed us well. I put that meat through a tough time to stretch it, I seasoned it so it would taste good and it fed us well. God will use the tough times we find ourselves in to stretch us, He'll season us and we'll feed others.

We had a day off with Donnie and Catriona which was also bliss as we travelled as far West as you can go down little single track roads that bent and twisted and rose up and down and exposed stunning little beaches and stunning scenery wherever we went. We picnicked at the most Westerly point in the beautiful sunshine and to look out on that huge expanse of ocean with nothing on it and stretching as far as the eye could see was awesome. As you looked along the coastline and saw the crisp white waves break on the shoreline it was just beautiful... and the air was so pure and unsullied. We just felt so blessed to be there. We have been going to Lewis for eleven years and we always receive a great welcome and feel one of the family. When you go back to a place a year later and you feel you've never been away it is just so special - at times you even take up conversations where you left off!!

At the Salvation Army concert a lady came out for prayer because she was in such pain with her back and she was touched by God and healed, Praise God. I have never felt such heat go through my hand into her back - isn't our God good! That lady left, not in pain, but with a huge smile on her face - which was still there days later when someone from New Wine Church met her in the street. That's God!
